

### **GENERAL ORGANIZATION OF THE BOOKLET**

The booklet is organized in three main levels: **Level 1** for beginners of the English Language, **Level 2** for an intermediate class and **Level 3** for advanced students. Besides, each level has been divided into **three sessions** in which learners will have an approach to the story, plot, characters and they will have the possibility to solve creative activities before the play.

The amount of time to complete each session is between 30 and 50 minutes.

## THE PLOT

In the heart of the Brazilian rainforest, a secluded Amazonian tribe thrives in harmony with its surroundings. Chief Mará, a wise and resolute leader, protects her people and their traditions while navigating the delicate balance between the spiritual and natural worlds. Her younger sister, Ayla, is adventurous and inquisitive, constantly yearning to explore the mysteries of the jungle. The tribe's everyday life is lightened by Kauê, their loyal and humorous companion, whose resourcefulness often comes to their aid.

The tranquility of the tribe is disrupted by the arrival of Lukas, a zealous researcher equipped with his ever-present tablet. Lukas ostensibly seeks to document the jungle's natural wonders, yet his true mission is far more insidious. Unbeknownst to the tribe, he is secretly surveying the land for a lucrative tourism project orchestrated by his profit-driven employer.

As Lukas immerses himself in the tribe's way of life, his perspective begins to shift. Ayla's boundless curiosity and the tribe's connection to the land awaken in him a newfound appreciation for the untouched beauty of the jungle. However, his growing bond with the tribe is tested when his duplicity is uncovered. Chief Mará confronts Lukas, demanding an explanation for his covert activities, and the tribe is forced to reconcile their hospitality with the threat he represents.

Matters escalate when Lukas's employer, a shrewd and unyielding businessman, arrives with plans to decimate the forest to pave the way for a sprawling resort. Confronted with the destruction his actions would bring, Lukas must wrestle with his conscience. The tribe, resolute in their desire to protect their sacred home, offers him an ultimatum: will he stand with them to defend the jungle, or will he succumb to the lure of ambition and progress?

## **CREATIVE WRITING: "A LETTER TO THE JUNGLE"**

Imagine the Amazon jungle is alive and can write a letter to the people of the world. Think about what the jungle would say to express its feelings about how humans treat it. Then, imagine you are a member of the Amazon tribe writing a reply to the jungle's letter.

### PART 1: The Jungle's Letter

- » Write as if you are the jungle. Describe your beauty, your animals, and how you help the world (providing oxygen, being a home to creatures, etc.).
- » Explain how human activities like deforestation or pollution make you feel.
- » End your letter with a question asking people to think about how they can help protect you.

### **PART 2: Your Reply**

- » Now, write as a member of the Amazon tribe. Respond to the jungle's letter.
- » Reassure the jungle that your tribe respects and protects it.
- » Share what actions your tribe takes to preserve it, and how you wish others would do the same.

#### Example Start:

The Jungle's Letter:

"Dear People of the World,

I am the Amazon jungle, the green heart of your planet. I provide shade, air, and a home for countless creatures. Yet, I feel sad and scared as my trees are cut down and my rivers grow dirty..."

### Your Reply:

"Dear Amazon Jungle,

We hear your voice and understand your pain. As members of the tribe, we do everything we can to live in harmony with you..."

Illustrate your letters with drawings of the jungle and its creatures to bring your words to life.
